WDA work with a range of partners to continue Eddie's legacy and provide support, training and activities for multicultural young people aged 12-25 through 'Young G'.

Who Is Eligible?

WDA Settlement Services are available to eligible migrants in Horsham, with outreach services to Hindmarsh, Northern Grampians, West Wimmera and Yarriambiack municipalities.

Eligible Migrants are humanitarian entrants and other vulnerable migrants, during their first five years of settlement in Australia.

We provide FREE and CONFIDENTIAL settlement assistance including individual advice and casework, referrals to agencies and services, information sessions, support groups and training. We also provide assistance with Centrelink & Vic Roads appointments.

We collaborate with local migrant community groups and organisations to deliver special events and festivals to celebrate the diversity of our region.

Anubha Jalla Das was born and raised in India, but choose to migrate to Horsham four years ago with her family.

While originally nervous about the move, she remembered that Australia was "the land of opportunity."

"I danced back in India, but I never had that much opportunity than what I do now in Horsham," she said.

Since moving to Horsham, Mrs Jalla Das has become the organiser of Oasis's 'Taste of the World' events, dance group instructor and the coordinator for Jellybeans Playgroup.

"Settlement Services have helped me feel very connected to Horsham. Jellybeans was established by the Wimmera Development Association to support migrant families to socialise, share their values, traditions and connect with communities and the local area. It is my pleasure to be the coordinator. I know first hand how hard it can be for new mums settling into a new area and I want them to feel comfortable, supported and happy."
